

IETF IPM Technical Legal Provisions 6.0 (ISE Stream)

Legal Provisions Relating to Independent Submissions

Effective Date: December 1, 2026 (proposed)

1. Background.

The IETF Trust was formed on December 15, 2005, for, among other things, the purpose of acquiring, holding, maintaining and licensing certain existing and future intellectual property used in connection with the Internet standards process and its administration and for the advancement of science and technology associated with the Internet and related technology. Accordingly, pursuant to RFC 5378, Contributors granted the IETF Trust certain licenses with respect to their IETF Contributions. In RFC 5377, the IETF Community provided the IETF Trust with guidance regarding licenses that the IETF Trust should grant to others with respect to such IETF Contributions and IETF Documents. The legal provisions of the IETF Trust described the rights and licenses that the IETF Trust was authorized to grant to others with respect to such IETF Contributions and IETF Documents; as well the authority to develop and enforce certain restrictions, limitations and notices relating to IETF Documents. The legal provisions of the IETF Trust also applied to other document streams that requested that the IETF Trust act as licensing administrator. The legal provisions of the IETF Trust, as carried over in the IETF IPMC described below, and the processes developed by the IETF Trust and now administered by the IPMC, are referred to in this document as the IETF Technical Legal Provisions. Capitalized terms used in this document that are not otherwise defined have the meanings set forth in RFC XXXX (née RFC 5378).

1.1 IETF Intellectual Property Management Corporation (IPMC)

The IETF Intellectual Property Management Corporation (IPMC) succeeded the IETF Trust and the copyrights assigned previously to the IETF Trust, as well as the other intellectual property held by the IETF Trust were transferred to the IPMC in February 2026. Shortly thereafter, the IETF IPMC released this updated Technical Legal Provisions version 6.0 carrying over the previous TLP 5.0 licensing terms with the updates necessary to recognize the succession from the IETF Trust to the IETF IPMC as the copyright holder and licensor.

References to “IETF Trust” in prior TLP versions and in notices within previously published IETF contributions and documents should be understood to now refer to the IETF IPMC. Questions related to those prior works should be directed to the IETF IPMC.

1.2 Changes from TLP 5.0

The IETF IPMC was recognized as the successor to the IETF Trust within the scope of IETF Intellectual Rights process documents including RFC 5378 and RFC 5377 by RFC XXXX including replacing the IETF IPMC as the recipient of the rights previously granted to the IETF Trust.

The IETF Trust website (trustee.ietf.org) will remain available as the source of information for prior TLP versions 1.0 through 5.0, which continue to apply to documents published before the Effective Date of this version of the Legal Provisions.

The IETF IPMC has established the IETF IPM website (www.ietf-ipm.org) as the new website to hold TLP 6.0 and beyond materials and documents.

1.3 License Terms Changes from TLP 5.0

No changes have been made to the licensing terms covered by this document, with the exceptions noted below in section 1.3.1, from TLP 5.0.

1.3.1 List of Changes from TLP 5.0

- a. The Independent Stream has been given its own stream-specific document.
- b. The IETF Trust has been replaced with the IETF IPMC in the text for required notices, boilerplate from TLP 5.0.

2. Applicability of these Legal Provisions.

a. These Legal Provisions are effective as of **December 1, 2026** (the “Effective Date”).

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b. *Adoption by Alternate Streams.* This document reflects the legal rules that apply to documents in the Independent Stream, as established by the Independent Submission Editor. The IETF IPMC has updated these Legal Provisions to reflect the specific manner in which it

will act, consistently with the stated wishes of the Alternate Stream manager to the extent consistent with the IETF IPMC's legal obligations and the instructions of the IETF community embodied in RFC 5377 and elsewhere.

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d. *Responsibility of Alternate Stream Contributors.* Sections 5.c and 6.c.iii of these Legal Provisions shall not apply to Alternate Stream documents, thus contributors of Contributions to Alternate Streams must assure themselves that they comply with the representations and warranties required under RFC XXXX, including under Section 5.6 of RFC XXXX, with respect to the entirety of their Alternate Stream Contributions prior to making the contribution.

f. *Independent Submission Stream.* Pursuant to RFC 5744 published on December 17, 2009, the manager of the Independent Submission Stream has requested that the IETF Trust act as licensing administrator for the Independent Submission Stream and that these Legal Provisions be applied to documents submitted and published in the Independent Submission Stream following December 28, 2009. **The Legal Provisions for the Independent stream are documented herein.**

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a. Certain RFCs may contain text designated as “Template Text” by the inclusion of the following legend in the introduction to the RFC:

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
